Parents Responsibilities

The main responsibility of the parent is to have their child ready to play the sport and have fun. Other responsibilities include:

- Transportation to/from practices and games including on time arrival and timely pickup
- Support the Coaches (remember the Coaches are volunteers spend a lot of time teaching your child)
- Cheer for all kids on the field (both teams). This is a recreational league and undesired behavior ruins the fun for all participants: players, parents and coaches, so keep it fun for everyone!

Remember, this is a Recreational League. It should be fun for everyone. Although winning a game is fun, winning should be very low on the list of priorities for participants, parents and coaches. These recreational leagues are setup to help participants learn the fundamentals for the sport, participate as a team member, provide sportsmanship to all team players, and to improve their ability to play the sport.

Game Rainouts / Makeups

Depending on the field, rain during the day does not necessary mean that an evening game will be cancelled. Please check this information prior to coming to a game. Uniforms and Safety Equipment

The NBAA issues each player a uniform consisting of a shirt, pants, and a hat. All players will properly wear the complete uniform furnished by the NBAA in order to play, with shirts tucked in, caps with bill forward, and socks under pant legs. Since the pants are returned and used for several years, they should be worn only for games and label instructions for laundering should be carefully followed. Only roster players may wear the team uniform. Catchers are not required to wear caps under the catcher's mask; however, they must wear all catchers' equipment furnished by the NBAA. Deliberate refusal to wear all designated equipment may cause forfeiture of the game. Players may NOT wear metal spiked shoes.

Your child's coach will be collecting the pants at the end of the season. Your help in laundering them and returning them to the coach on a timely basis is necessary and appreciated.

Team pictures will be taken on **Saturday June 7th** at Hickory Grove (Cleveland and Sunny Slope). Your coach will provide you with information on the time that your team is scheduled along with an order packet if you are interested in purchasing individual pictures.
